Driving Equitable Health in Collin County

About this Grant

Driving Equitable Health addresses the escalation of hypertension, food and nutrition insecurity, and mental health issues leading to higher rates of chronic diseases within under-resourced communities through a clinic-to-community approach to self-managed healthcare. Together, the American Heart Association (AHA), City Bridge Urgent Care (CBUC) and the Assistance Center of Collin County (ACCC) will take a holistic approach for patients to self-manage their chronic disease health risks by providing the tools, resources, referrals, training on best practices and counseling needed to overcome the obstacles to making healthy choices for disease prevention and management.

Program Milestones

To achieve by December 2024

Improve health outcomes of underserved Collin County residents by increasing opportunities to access quality healthcare, education on nutrition and chronic disease management, and health coaching to empower participants to adopt healthier lifestyle habits.



- Provide 500 patients with a self-monitoring blood pressure kit.
- Provide all patients with health counseling related to nutrition, exercise prescription, mental health and other lifestyle choices that impact their health.
- · Screen all patients for food insecurity and offer nutrition counseling and referral to local food assistance programs (pantries, foodbanks, etc.) when appropriate.

Transforming Lives Through Collaboration

The American Heart Association (AHA) created a collaboration with community clinics to provide a much-needed health intervention that addresses the escalation of hypertension and provides a clinic-to-community linkage that empowers patients to take preventative action to improve




As an example of the data used to analyze the ZIP codes and determine areas of focus in each Texas Health Community Impact region, the following is a snapshot of information for Plano 75074.





Conditions in the environments in which people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks. Through Texas Health Community Impact grants, we are trying to address the whole person-not just a disease.



Health Equity Index (HEI)


HEI incorporates estimates for six different social and economic determinants of health that are associated with poor health outcomes.

FII is a measure of food access that is correlated with economic and household hardship.


Wealth Gap in Collin County


Median Household Income - 2021

Renters spending 30% or more of household income on rent. In census tract 032008, percentage of households experiencing rent burden:






Transportation


Blood Pressure Prevalence
