# Collaboration by the People, for the Community

#### **About this Grant**

To increase efficiency and effectiveness of community-based organizations (CBO) in identified areas, this effort led by the Center for Nonprofit Management (CNM) will build the foundation for addressing mental health and maximize the impact of future Texas Health Community Impact grants. Through this grant, CNM will facilitate community-driven development and leverage cross-sector collaboratives to identify and implement innovative, community-wide interventions to address social determinants of health, like navigation to resources for affordable transportation, housing, and healthy food.

#### **Program Milestones**

#### To reach by December 2023

- Develop individual organizational capacity to streamline services for consumers.
- Increase quantitative and qualitative data related to social determinants of health and navigation to services.

#### To reach by December 2024

• Invest in needed infrastructure for successful cross-sector collaboration in the countyincluding strengthening of organizational capacity, and development of needed processes such as collaborative internal and external communication, reporting and data collection.

## An Innovative Approach

Underserved communities often struggle with a lack of access to healthy food, housing, transportation, and healthcare. In many cases, behavioral health is at the core of these challenges.

In Kaufman County, a new grant—Collaboration by the People, for the Community—is building a foundation from which existing community resources can unite to tackle the Social



This innovative grant spanning efforts within Erath, Johnson and Kaufman Counties will support and fund multiple agencies in each county.

Determinants of Health including the root causes of mental health and identify sustainable interventions. Led by the Center for Nonprofit Management (CNM), this effort aims to increase the capacity of cross-sector community organizations to collaborate effectively.

Pam Corder, a project manager for Kaufman County and Texas Health Community Impact Dallas/Kaufman Leadership Council member, is enthusiastic about the opportunity to join community leaders in creating long-term improvements in health and well-being.

"This grant is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for Kaufman County," Corder said. "This is an opportunity for us to share and learn from each other in developing a one-stop shop for individuals who need mental healthcare and other services."

Pam is hopeful that one of the grant's outcomes will be lessening the time between when individuals reach out for help and when they receive that help. She said the technology and infrastructure resources will open new avenues for connecting to and assisting with the needs of residents and resource providers.

#### NAVIGATION

At least 88 percent of adults living in the U.S. have health literacy inadequate to navigate the healthcare system and promote their well-being.

"Maybe it [navigation to services] exists, but we do not know—it has not been communicated to the community."
